- -Management grader policy: just completed it, the goal is to, among other things, keep the identity of the grader secret to students and forbid graders of exiting their building with papers/exams/assignments

CSS Nov. 18

- Strategic plan for next three years being developed
 - Forecasting increasingly worse depression, anxiety, suicidality amongst students
 - Redefining what student services means
 - Highlighting key issues like that the world is becoming an increasingly complex and less navigable place for students and unprecedented stressors are testing students' resilience
- Budget
 - student -derived funding has slowly accounted for a lesser proportion of their total funding
 - Total expenditure has more than doubled (I believe) in last 10 years
 - # of physicians 19->23, counselors 26->40
 - But are these FT (-Andre)
 - Have been running deficit for last 3 fiscal years
 - University has committed in writing to matching SSMU
 - University is also waiving the "tax" they've traditionally levied on standalone units
 - The bookstore has to pay McGill a certain overhead
 - This releases 400k for SS
