ISABELLA ANDERSON (ARTS SENATOR)

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Senate Committees:

- CSS → met on Wednesday, September 27th
 - Discussed the mandate and upcoming activities of the committee for the year → thinking of running to be the Student Co-Chair for the Committee this year
 - Updates from Martine Gauthier on the projects coming to Student Services, including:
 - The state of the Eating Disorder Program,
 - The results of the internal audit (can update orally),
 - McGill Wellness Strategy (can also update orally for details)

SSMU Committees:

- I will try to keep everyone updated either on the motions coming to Council or I will use this space in my report to just do a quick update of notable Legislative Council items, since Steering Committee just makes the to-be-approved agenda[®]

Discussions had with Faculty:

- Updates from AUS Council:
 - Voted to double a fee for a first-year, required Geography course, and will be putting the Executive from this Department in contact with administration to discuss how to provide forms of financial aid to those who cannot afford this

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- extra cost for a program requirement if these do not already exist (Executive was unsure as to whether or not aid is available)
- Approved a motion to mandate all AUS Executives, Departmental Executives, and Arts Senators to be trained in equity and inclusivity by the second week of October each year.
 - I motioned to amend this to include the Senators, as SSMU does not currently provide this training, and it allows us to be better trained to interact with our Faculty
- Working to advertise some personal Office Hours in the AUS listserv (and hopefully on the SSMU website in my bio) in order to promote outreach with my Faculty (and the larger student population)!

- Committee on Enrolment and Student Affairs (CESA)
 - Tuesday September 12th, 2017

 - Now, admission would depend 80% on GPA and 20% on CASPer result
 - Also discussed a proposed scholarship for students who are legally blind
 - Was approved pending certain revisions

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Senate/McGill admin:

- OERs
 - Working on a Powerpoint presentation -- am looking to hold an information session in
 November (the date is TBD) to spread the word about the OER movement
 - Spoke to SUS VP Academic about a workgroup
 - Will email all the departmental VP Academics to gauge interest in a workgroup (it's too much work to do alone, guys)
 - Looking to meet with Colleen Cook (Dean of Libraries) to see what work has already been done and what work we can do still
 - Is anyone interested in helping?

Committees:

- ESAAC Oct 3
 - o First meeting
 - Was basically a discussion session for the Assessment Policy
 - Making them guidelines leaves too much room for interpretation -- should we make it a policy? And have adaptations at the faculty level?
 - Expand item 4 and more wordsmithing

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- The Provost will decide on pathway forward
- Might start a workgroup
- Is not brought to Chairs yet -- more work to be done
- Talked briefly about the BoEd secondary math program
 - Students applying are not made aware that it's a math intense program (but they're supposed to be trying to teach math???) and have high expectations so they do badly and have to drop the program because they didn't take the CEGEP/high school courses (I guess uni is more difficult)
 - The conclusion was that they would make some math courses pre-reqs so they don't have to take them at McGill
- Discussed introducing A+ at McGill -- thoughts?!
 - It was apparently brought to Senate before and was opposed to by the student Senators -- go figure

SUS:

- General Council meeting
 - Did not attend (had a date with CHEM 302)
 - Informed VP Internal of "university context" and Science Games -- will follow up on it this week
- My exec meetings are the exact same time and Senate Caucus so I never make them -- need to read the minutes

Nahal Fansia (Nursing Senator)

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Committees:

- Senate Committee on Physical Development
 - September 21, 2017
 - Master plan for Royal Victoria Hospital.
 - October 11-13 2017: presentation of the master plan at the Y intersection.
 - ➤ Library project: remodeling of McLennan and Redpath Libraries.
 - Millions of books rather than hundreds-> would be stored offsite
 - Plan to improve better access from Roddick gates to the library
 - Officially full ownership of 680 Sherbrooke
 - Plan to make the building more academic like rather office like

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- 3 floors for Ingram School of Nursing-> was done to due to accreditation requirements.
- Psychology and Medicine to move to 2001 McGill College in future
- West block of Stewart Bio
 - Being reconstructed from the inside.
- MacDonald Harrington building
 - Work being done on roof, water infiltration, and windows.
- Leacock Terrace
 - Being rebuilt. Improved outdoor space, more useable space
 - No schedule for the renovation
- > Rutherford Building
 - Ventilation system being installed in labs
- Roddick Gates
 - o Exterior part of the gates have been renovated
 - Planning to renovate the inner phase
 - Installation of bike racks on the West side
- > Extension of new generator / energy on campus
- Bike centre
 - Pending, SSMU Legislative Council to vote on this
 - o Will be a bicycle parking garage in University Centre
 - 1.9 million dollar project
- MacDonald Campus of McGill University
 - Final stages of engagement center on the farm: could be used for conferences, there will be classrooms. Will also be used for welcoming primary and kindergarten students. Old barn that will be transformed.
 2.5 million dollar project
 - o Britain Hall: a new initiative with John Abbott College
 - Potential project: store 3-4 million books in a new building

Honorary Degrees and Convocations Committee

- ➤ E-vote on the conferral of the Lifetime Achievement Award for Leadership in Learning (HDCC17-01)
 - o Committee approved of this recommendation
 - Recommendation was presented at the Senate on September 19, 2017 for approval
