- Flu shots
 - Past: we have bought vaccines and sold them
 - Now with the accessible fee regulations, not able to give vaccines with a fee.
 - 200\$ to buy in pharmacy and 160\$ when doing in McGill clinic
- 20 physicians working there, 3.8 full time equivalence
 - A little low
 - Would want to increase
- Psychiatry: 7 full -time equivalence
- Student wellness action plans (SWAP)
 - Health and wellness strategy
 - Change the current the wellness in student life
 - Example : sleep hygiene, effective contraception
 - Encourage previous services as well as trying to have new services
 - Front line services
 - Think about that
 - Before only the receptionists
 - Now having two dedicated individuals to answer phone
 - Will increase front line staffs in the future

• Discussions had with Faculty

- Frosh director for 2018 elected
- Student Balance Month
 - It was called occupational balance month before, 3 weeks with small activities to de-stress a few activities include therapy dogs, zumba class, arts class, yoga
 - Thinking of doing it the week before march break and two weeks after. The week before march break would be mainly for the undergraduates and the two weeks after more for the master students
 - 2-3 days/week in hosmer or davis house
 - Would be interesting to have someone give a talk on mental health for example, like someone from the well office.
- QY liaison meeting
 - QY still feel a little separated from the U3 cohort.
 - Maybe having a QY liaison meeting, so a questionnaire to fill out by the QY and an open/informal meeting between U3 and QY cohort
 - Maybe having an orientation/frosh for the QY, SPOTGSA could be in charge as they do not fall in POTUS.



- There was a picnik but was not very successful, a lot of the U3 reps came and SPOTGSA as well but not great, might be better to have some kind of like Montreal orientation
- Anatomy workshop -->Could be open to U3 as well
- Talent show recap

- It was a good experience presenting and a trial run for next time

ESAAC:

- Creation of a new minor for International Experiential Learning
 - Students will receive credits for studying abroad
 - This won't apply for students who've already gone abroad unfortunately but once it's been implemented it will count thereon
- Embedded Wellness Access
 - They're renovating the clinic to try a new model for accessibility for mental health resources
 - A "triage system" where the patient comes in an speaks first to a triage *social worker* (it was made VERY clear that they will not be councillors) who will be trained appropriately to determine the urgency and what support the student needs
 - Was made clear that the social worker would assist directly the patient in getting to the proper resource (I was worried they'd just give them a number to call, that's a whole other issue to worry about when someone's in need of help and would just defeat the purpose completely so I was glad to hear it)
- Proposal to Change Academic Dates for Fall 2018
 - This part took no discussion at all because there was a scheduling mistake when they first passed the dates at Senate years ago
 - They just wanted to change the first day of classes to a Monday schedule to make sure the Monday classes don't lose hours
- Proposal to address registration issue for returning students
 - This was an interesting one
 - Rather than have students register on days according to their faculty and year it will be assigned by year and credit number remaining in a degree
 - The purpose of this is so that students who are closest to graduating will be able to choose the courses they absolutely need to graduate and there will be no issue regarding whether they can get into the course and no question of whether or not they'll graduate
 - This seemed like a better alternative to random assigning/lottery (no one wants to have their academic future depend on chance so this gave it some structure)
 - This will be implemented for this upcoming school year so each student will receive a date and time they will be permitted to register during
 - Side-note: it hit me during this discussion that I won't be registering for courses anymore and it got me really sad :(
