- Concern that CSS is also a place where students can hold S2
 accountable for its use of student fees, and future structure would
 have to incorporate that.
- Discussion will be sent to Senate to see their recommendations regarding the fate of CSS
- Innovation Fund Reports reviewed, most closed as no more funds remaining.
- EDSS Report
 - OVERHEAD FEES BEING ELIMINATED OVER NEXT TWO YEARS (250k next year, and full 500k year after that).
 - WILL GO TO REFERENDUM FOR FEE INCREASE NEXT YEAR
 - Health Hub design is ongoing. Will be going on into January 2019.
 Interim place will be opening. Embedded Wellness Advisers moving forward, with 10 people over the next two years.
 - Communications director spot still open. (1 fired, 1 resigned).
- University Health Services Committee (UHSC)
 - March 5th meeting cancelled, next one on April 30th
- Teaching & Learning Services (TLS)
 - Met on Feb 20th
 - Discussion around Assessment Policy
 - Current policy has lots of exceptions, given different assessment measures in different faculties.
 - Revision was very difficult, thought was to come up with assessment principles that could first be adopted, to frame an actual policy.
 - 5c: no predetermined set of quotas. (roughly means no curving), and
 1.x which says grading is not to compare different students
 - Very controversial for management, where class average capped at 74.99, and grades are essential for people hiring to do that comparison.
 - F/U Meeting on March 16th about assessment (many students invited)
