ESAAC met on 11/6

- Created ad-hoc subcommittees on Fall Reading Week, Involuntary Leave Policy, and Cannabis Policy
 - Fall Reading Week subcom will include representation from varied faculties and from students
 - Cannabis Policy to be reworked into one overarching policy on smoking, drugs, alcohol, etc.
- Open discussion on S/U option
 - Data was gathered on current usage of the S/U option
 - 1600 total usages in Fall 2018
 - 54% at the 200 level
 - Most courses taken in Arts by students from a wide array of faculties
 - Courses in FRSL, ECON, GEOG, etc.
 - Want to make sure this is a one-time decision (eg. can't change back to S/U) and that the reverse can't happen (no letter grade \rightarrow S/U)
 - Science leans no
 - Would want courses originally S/U (even if switch to letter grade) to count to percent of total courses in degree a student can take S/U
 - Fabrice is in favor, some Assoc. Deans skeptical
- First-time exam deferral w/o documentation update
 - Want to add disclaimer notifying students of the consequences of deferring
- Code of Student Conduct being revised, Buddle wanting to bring notice to Nov Senate, for vote in Dec.
